ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

I. **ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT**

Any graduating student who achieves an "A" average as defined below will be recognized by having his/her name engraved on the "JEHS Academic Recognition 'A' Average" plaque located in the main stairwell at the high school building.

Additionally, the middle/high school principal will establish and administer a program for formally recognizing student achievement. Formal student recognition for academic achievement will be conducted at least once each academic year.

II. **DETERMINATION OF:**

A. The "A" average is to be determined in correlation with the Honor Roll regulation as described below.

The Port Edwards School District grading system is as follows:

A = 4.00 points	B = 3.00 points	C = 2.00 points	D = 1.00 point
A- = 3.67 points	B- = 2.67 points	C- = 1.67 points	D- = 0.67 points
B+ = 3.33 points	C+ = 2.33 points	D+ = 1.33 points	F = 0.00 points

At the end of every grading period, each student's total points are divided by the number of credits attempted for a grade point average. That grade point average (GPA) is the number used to determine whether or not a student is eligible for Honor Roll. A student with all As (4.0 GPA) is eligible for Straight A Honors. Students with a GPA of 3.67-3.99 qualify for High Honors; any student with a GPA of 3.0-3.66 is eligible for Honors.

B. At the end of the semester use the semester average.

C. At the end of the year use the end of course grades to determine Academic Year standing.
