ACCESS BY MILITARY RECRUITERS, PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYERS AND POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS

Parents of students in grades 9-12 and/or students eighteen years of age or older, are requested to complete a form indicating whether they grant permission for their child's name, or if they are an adult student their own name, address, and telephone number to be released to military recruiters. In the event the parent/student fails to complete and return the form to the school, all requests for this information by the military will be honored.

High school principals are prohibited from excluding military recruiters from the campus if prospective employers or post-secondary institutions are not similarly prohibited from recruiting students. It is the policy of the Port Edwards Public School District that military recruiters, prospective employers and post-secondary institutions will be allowed access to its students, with the exception of those students who have themselves filed an objection, or whose parent has filed an objection on their behalf, for the purpose of recruiting.

Parental Objection to Release of High School Student Information to Military Recruiters, Prospective Employers and Institutions of Higher Learning

A recently enacted federal law mandates the release of the name, address and telephone number of your child to military recruiters, prospective employers or institutions of higher learning.
